Minutes from Meeting  
February 28, 2011

I. Greeting and Introduction

II. Old Business

A. President Grant opened the meeting with the following actions:

1. Announced the membership must vote on the \$300 stipend to be paid Beth Ireland for her April 23<sup>rd</sup> demonstration. A motion was made and seconded to approve this expenditure and the vote was unanimous in favor of the motion.

2. Ron Leuthner has been appointed treasurer replacing Bill Gohdes who remains club secretary.

3. Roger Jessup has been appointed as Raffle Master.

B. A count of members present at the beginning of the evening's demonstration indicated that twenty nine (29) members were in attendance.

C. Treasurers Report: Treasurer Ron Leuthner reported the club has approximately \$1771.24 in the account. Additional money was received for dues and for raffle income.

D. President Grant announced that a Public Relations Committee has been appointed and Lynn Reece, Walter McCrae, Dr. Bob Nix, and Ken Calkin have agreed to serve on the Committee. This committee has been assigned the tasks of broadening our visibility within the greater metropolitan area and to publicize the upcoming workshop of Beth Ireland on April 23<sup>rd</sup>. A suggestion was made from the floor that we pursue having the workshop at Lyndon House and President Grant agreed to explore this possibility.

III. New Business

A. Dr. Grant announced that CCW has been invited by the American Association of Woodturners (AAW) to participate in a fund raising effort to relieve hunger through a donation to the *Empty Bowls Program*, a grassroots movement to help end hunger in the Upper Midwest. Donated bowls will be collected at the 2011 AAW Symposium in St. Paul and will be sold, the proceeds of which will go to the *Second Harvest* organization to fund food for the hungry. AAW is asking every chapter to contribute bowls to the project.

B. Dr. Grant announced that Bill Van Wie has updated the club website. Members are encouraged to log on and view the information presented there.

The Business Meeting concluded and was followed by Show and Tell and the raffle. Phil Coulson did a demonstration on box turning, roughing a bowl form, and presented club members with a home made finishing tool that is used to decorate turned objects.
